



GOAL AND OBJECTIVES

The overall goal of the program was to enhance public participation in owl conservation in Nepal.

The specific objectives were as follows

1. To discourage the hunting and trade of owls in Nepal by elevating conservation awareness of local people, media, and political leaders

- 2. To enhance the local capacity in owl conservation via education program
- 3. To recognize the hidden conservation heroes and sheroes of Nepal
- 4. To promote traditional culture and games of the area
- 5. To promote eco-tourism in the area
- 6. To encourage and mentor young graduates for owl conservation via opportunity of volunteering

BACKGROUND

Nepal Owl Festival has been gradually expanding and evolving into multifaceted event since its inception in 2012. The Nepal Owl Festival is celebrated in solidarity of the International Festival of Owls, which is celebrated in Houston, Minnesota every year in March.

Our aim was to take the festival to different parts of the country, where illegal hunting and trading has caused serious threat to the owl species. We create a fun festive atmosphere where people could access a variety of information about the species and interact with conservationist and vice-versa to raise awareness of the need to protect owls found in Nepal.

Although the main festival is a two-day event, our team members meticulously plan months in advance to find the ideal location and work in coordination with local agencies. A month before the event, our team in Kathmandu office simultaneously plans the festival site and makes all the essential festival preparations. The initial planning step includes making logistic plans and gathering festival display elements. Our staff and volunteers, who come from a variety of professional backgrounds, work tirelessly as a dedicated team to support and advance our work.

Local community members and representatives play a significant role in constructing and promoting the event, they work together with us to make the festival enjoyable and knowledgeable and so it is very crucial to establish good relationship with local community. A festival management committee (one) and sub-committees (seven) are established after reaching an agreement with a local organization/local community. This is followed by multiple meetings to apportion roles, to plan and discuss event structure, venue, and other aspects of the events.

We begin our social media promotions a few weeks before the events so that more people from all regions of Nepal would learn about it and be able to plan a potential weekend vacation. The event frequently attracts some curious foreign visitors, who visit us during the festival.

A few weeks before the festival, conservation awareness camps are held in schools around the village of festival site. Through an engaging and interactive presentation by our professionals, the young children are educated about owls and their significance. For owl-themed poems, story, and essays, an interschool competition was held. Winners of the competition are awarded during the festival and their work is displayed in the owl museum.

The team travels to the event site a few days beforehand to set up the venue after making sure everything is ready. We collaborate with local organizers at the venue, plan event components and work on schedules.


Finally, on the day of the festival we celebrate together.

PROMOTION

The promotion for the festival began a month before the event through sharing of promotional videos and photos about the venue, program description and promotional materials on our Facebook page. We also announced a call for the poster presentation on our official Facebook page for national and international researchers to present their research and conservation activities during the festival. A press conference was conducted on January 25th in Kusma, district headquarter of Parbat, with the goal of reaching a wider audience and providing event details. The conference was attended by journalists (24) from different local and national media outlets. We also paid-boosted our festival post for a week on Facebook to reach a larger audience digitally. Banners were set up at the festival site after the press conference, and their photos were shared in Facebook groups. Various renowned personnel across the country and abroad shared the event on their personal social media profiles. We regularly share updates about preparation, weather forecasts, event details, logistics and transportation details on social media.



















OVERVIEW

Nepal has 23 species of Owls, and we are trying to protect and celebrate these magnificent creatures which serves a great ecological value to the food chain, from any possible threats like habitat destruction, illegal hunting through mass gathering spreading awareness and sharing cultural programs.

Every year FON Nepal has been organizing Nepal Owl Festival in different parts of the country. The festival occurs for two days long in collaboration with local parties, the programs aim to spread awareness on owl conservation as well as promote local tourism. This year, the 11th Nepal Owl Festival was held in Jaljala-5, Lekhphant, Lopre, Parbat on 2-3 February, successfully gathered public raising awareness about owl conservation by blending conservation, culture, traditional games, and art. The festival took place at Malika Basic School, attracting around 3000 numbers of people including locals, students, researchers, and conservationists across the country. Before the festival, conservation camps were organized in fourteen schools to educate students about the ecological importance of owls. This initiative reached out to 800 numbers of students. The festival featured an owl museum, cultural programs, organizational stalls, local traditions, cuisines, and games, including face and nail painting, which engaged visitors and effectively communicated about messages conservation and the ecological roles of owls.

FESTIVAL SITE

Nepal Owl Festival 2024 was held in Jaljala Rural Municipality-5, Lekhphant, Lopre, Gandaki Province, Nepal. The location was 13 km uphill from the Beni Bazar, district headquarter of Myagdi at an altitude of 2300m and about 291 km away from Kathmandu. The Dhaulagiri range, Annapurna range and Mt Machhapuchre are the major scenic attraction of the place. The village has a large area of barren land with small hillocks with large patch of pine forest. Green-backed Tit, Long-tailed Minivet, Nutcracker, and Streaked Laughing thrush were few of the observed avifauna around Lopre. The main residency people were Pun in the uphill and Chettri in downhill. Lopre village has one homestay i.e. Lopre Falamedanda Community Homestay for domestic or foreign tourists. During the festival period, we have managed temporary homestays with basic facilities to accommodate large number of visitors.

The beauty of Parbat captivated everyone's hearts. Our team and guests were fortunate to experience snowfall a day before the festival, adding to the welcoming atmosphere of the event.

How to reach Lopre ?

- 1. Bus from Kathmandu to Beni.
- 2. From Beni, you have the option to hire a jeep or take a local jeep uphill to Lopre.
- 3. The journey from Pokhara to Beni takes approximately 2 hours, covering a road distance of 82 kilometers.
- 4. From Beni, it takes about 2 hours to reach Lopre, which is approximately 13 kilometers uphill.

PREPARATION OF THE FESTIVAL

The local partnership has always been crucial for the Nepal Owl Festival. Our team members visited the place numerous times before finalizing the venue. A series of meetings and coordination with the local community was conducted to discuss the components of festival. Natural Resource Conservation Organization, Lopre came forward to partner with FON Nepal for organizing the festival and took all the responsibilities of local arrangements. Following a positive interaction, discussions were held regarding the festival schedule, work distribution, budget, venue, school competition, conservation camp and accommodation. Subsequently, the *Nepal Owl Festival 2024 Organizing Committee* was formed in Lopre, Parbat, chaired by Yam Kumari Gurung which includes 17 committee members. Apart from this, 7 sub-committees were formed to take responsibilities of security, cultural arrangements, games, sanitation, and fund arrangements.

Responsibilities within the committee were assigned for organizing the Nepal Owl Festival. Malika Basic School was designated for museum venue, while the basketball ground was selected for setting up organizational stalls. Additionally, the forefront ground near the school was identified as the ideal location for setting up the stage and accommodating the crowd.

Two weeks after the initial meeting, a follow-up session was conducted to review progress on the festival preparations, including stage setup, cultural program arrangements facilitated by local participants as stage setup and coordination with the school for organizing art, essay, and poem competitions. Later, one of our team members Suman Hamal visited to Lopre to conduct conservation camp around the school of festival sites. Also few days later, press conference was also held with journalists from different local and national media outlets.

Meanwhile, the remaining team members in Kathmandu were busy preparing for the festival. They managed everything from packing necessary items like curio, information charts, drawings, paintings, owl frames, and owl books, banners, posters, stationery, wires/bulbs, designed certificates, awards, museum specimen and owl masks, to inviting guests and confirming organizational stalls and volunteer teams. As the festival days approached, we gathered volunteers to pack all the items rapidly and get ready to travel to the festival venue.

All our volunteers arrived at the festival site on 28th January 2024 that is four days before the festival. From the day after, all the volunteers worked diligently to unpack all the items and prepare the decoration for setting up the owl museum.

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OWL CONSERVATION CAMP

Students were educated about owls, their ecological significance, and the threats they face. Through slide presentations and owl-related videos, students learned about the importance of conserving these birds. Over 748 numbers of students participated in this conservation camp. Out of 748 students, 353 students have seen owl, 2 students have seen owl egg, 193 have heard the owl call, 10 of the students have consumed their meat, 274 numbers of students have catapult and among them 9 have killed an Owl. We hope that our conservation messages reached to the students and teachers and lower the killing of an owl within the area.

BIRD WATCHING

During the Nepal Owl Festival, one of the favorite events is bird watching. We organize birding event as previous years, lasting 3 to 4 hours on both days of the festival. This year, Hira Malla from Pokhara Bird Society led the bird watching session and brought together 25 participants, including students and locals. In the pine-dominated forest area of Lopre participants witnessed diverse group of forest birds, raptors, and tits. The first day of the birding recorded 21 species followed by 29 species recorded in the second day. Asian Barred Owlet, Himalayan Griffon, Steppe Eagle, Yellow-billed Blue Magpie, Red-headed Tit, Rusty-flanked Treecreeper, Rock Bunting, Bearded Vulture, Black Eagle, Eurasian Skylark, and Russet Sparrow are the few birds observed during the birding session.







THE OWL MUSEUM

The owl museum creatively decorated by all the volunteers in four rooms was displayed for the festival. Local visitors explored the decorated rooms and showed interest in certain displays. The volunteers assisted them by providing knowledge about owls and discussing owl conservation efforts. The robotic owl, owl call device and documentaries about owls of Nepal caught the eye of many, especially children, and added an extra exciting element to the festival, amusing everyone.



Visitors were seen enjoying the local and traditional dances like *Purkhyauli Naach, Lakhe Naach, School Performance, Conservation Drama, Panche Baja, Jhankri, Suni Maya, Salaiju, Yanimaya Song, Theater Dance, Sorathi,* and *Bhajan.* Apart from these various local games like *Thelo Falne* (a kind of Shot Put game in which the spherical object known as '*thelo*' is thrown from starting point, and the farthest distance covered wins), *Bhurung* (locally made wooden object, rotates when thrown with the help of rope, the longest rotation time wins), *Ek Khutte* (a kind of cock fight, in which one leg is folded and supported by hand. Game played inside circle and pushing the opponent), and *Chil Chilla* were performed in the festival.

There is a separate documentary room, which showcases owl related documentaries, for instance owls of Nepal, ecological importance of owls, threats and myths, interesting facts/ behaviors, conservation measures, and previous owl festivals. The documentary runs the whole day and often seems crowded with people. Visitors seem to be excited and worrisome after leaving the documentary room and many of them discuss with our volunteers about their queries on owls.

CONSERVATION SPEECH

Nepal Owl Festival is one of the biggest conservation events in the country. Different veteran researchers and conservationists throughout the nation participate and deliver conservation speeches to highlight more about nature and environment.

Conservation speech was delivered by Raju Acharya (Country Representative, World Owl Trust, UK), highlighting the ecological roles of owls especially focusing on owls as friends of farmers. He shared his experiences of previous owl festivals and praised the locals for being positive on conservation of nature and biodiversity. He was unknown about the importance of owls in ecosystem and had committed to contribute on nature conservation. There were at least ten local politicians/representatives of local government who delivered their speech on what can be done locally to contribute to nature conservation.






NATURE CONSERVATION AWARDS

FON takes gratitude towards awarding and celebrating nature conservationist and local level conservationist in every Nepal Owl Festival. This year, Mr. Rajendra Suwal, Mr. Hirulal Dangaura, Mr. Yam Bahadur Rawat and Mr. Kumar Paudel were awarded for Nature Conservation Award (NPR 25000 and certificates for each) while Mr. Adipta Giri and Mr. Sameer Regmi has been awarded with Local Conservation Award for their dedication toward wildlife conservation. Bird Conservation Network (Kailali), a dedicated organization for birds in western Nepal, has also received organizational felicitation.

Rajendra Narsingh Suwal Researcher and Conservationist Head - Partnerships Development, WWF Nepal

Born in Kathmandu in 1962, Suwal's passion for exploring Nepal's diverse landscapes emerged at a young age. He commenced his journey as a naturalist at the Gaida Wildlife Camp from 1984 to 1990. Currently, he holds the esteemed position of Head of Partnerships Development at WWF Nepal. Inspired by influential figures like the late Hari Sharan Kaji and Karna Shakya, Suwal became a founding member of the 'Nepal Bird Conservation' at the age of 20. In 1994, he pioneered the concept of the Saras Crane Conservation Area in the Lumbini region. Additionally, he actively participates in the International Scientific Committee of Lumbini and the Environmental Protection Council for three years.

With a postgraduate degree in Zoology, Suwal embarked on a remarkable journey, covering 58 districts, engaging in wildlife research, bird observation, photography, and Eco-tourism. He has authored 15 research reports on various species, along with 19 scientific articles, seven of which focus on nature-related topics published in national newspapers. Suwal has played a pivotal role in Nepal's wildlife and tourism promotion, leading the production of 17 international documentaries showcasing Nepal's wildlife. Notably, in 1995, he authored the first red data book on wildlife published by the Government of Nepal. Suwal has been fortunate to host distinguished international figures such as former U.S. President Jimmy Carter (2013) and Japanese Crown Prince (Fumihito) (1996) during bird-watching visits to Nepal. Following in the footsteps of his father, the late Parashar Narsingh Suwal, a distinguished scientist, Rajendra Suwal has dedicated four decades to wildlife, biodiversity, and tourism. He firmly believes that studying, researching, and applying wildlife conservation practices can significantly contribute to the country's development. Beyond his academic contributions, Suwal has actively participated in conservation initiatives, documenting a new bird species (Bean Goose) for Nepal, and organizing various wildlife conservation workshops in Kathmandu, Lumbini, and Koshi regions. Notably, he is involved in the conservation and rescue efforts for owls in Nepal, showcasing his commitment to the broader cause of preserving Nepal's rich biodiversity.



Hirulal Dangaura Conservationist Field Project Officer, Bird Conservation Nepal

Hirulal Dangaura, aged 41, is a prominent advocate for bird conservation in Nepal. His conservation journey began as the president of the Eco Club at his school, founded in 2056 B.S. Over the past 24 years, Hirulal has actively studied, researched, and conserved waterfowl, migratory birds, dolphins, and other wildlife in the Kailali region. Starting during his school days, he participated in the Slang Shoot Control Campaign, contributing significantly by collecting over 3,000 slang shots. This effort earned him recognition through four national awards.For the last 14 years, Hirulal has served as a field project officer for Bird Conservation Nepal. He has actively participated in eight bird research expeditions across Nepal, contributing to 14 published scientific articles. Holding a postgraduate degree in 'Rural Development,' he is also involved in community-based initiatives.

Inspired by Bhoj Raj Shrestha (Guleli Baje), Hirulal has organized wildlife conservation camps for 75 schools and 250 local groups. Engaging 75 youth in the 'Community-Based Anti-Poaching Control' campaign, he has conducted over 10 radio interviews on bird-related topics. Hirulal documented 148 bird species in the Ghodaghodi region, including six owl species, and led the plantation of 22,000 seedlings. His active involvement led to the declaration of the 'Bird Conservation Sanctuary,' significantly impacting wildlife conservation in the region. Hirulal played a crucial role in organizing the 'Nepal Owl Festival' in Kailali District. Recently, he successfully rescued and rehabilitated five owl species in their natural habitat.



Yam Kumar Rawat *Conservationist* Ranger, Department of National Park and Wildlife Conservation

Born in the Salyan district, 33-year-old Yam Bahadur Rawat graduated from the Institute of Forestry, Pokhara. For the past eight years, he has been actively serving as a ranger in Banke and Shuklaphanta National Parks, acknowledged as an exemplary conservationist contributing to the study, research, and rescue of wildlife. His role model is conservationist Laxman Prasad Paudel. Yam Bahadur holds a particular interest in wildlife crime investigation, photography, and the rescue of reptiles. Recognizing the essential link between science and conservation, Yam Bahadur actively integrates scientific principles into his conservation work. Engaged in various wildlife crime control initiatives, he has almost lost his life twice in the line of duty. Despite these challenges, he continues to contribute regularly.

Yam Bahadur has directly investigated 60 wildlife crime incidents. He has been involved in over 1,000 forest patrols for wildlife conservation offenses. He has conducted 260 awareness campaigns/ workshop for the conservation of species. His efforts have led to the successful rehabilitation and release of over 80 mammals, reptiles, and birds, including the rescue of 1,200 snakes. He has played a vital role in organizing more than 200 bird-watching events and other wildlife observation events for many stakeholders. Yam Bahadur has authored eight scientific articles, and his book, "Butterflies of Shuklaphanta," has been published. He has recorded two species new for Nepal (Leopard Gecko and Laudankia Vine Snake). He has provided training to over 400 park employees on various dimensions of wildlife, including leadership roles. He has organized more than 50 human-wildlife conflict resolution workshops. His contributions extend to investigating illegal trade and the conservation of owls too. He has rescued two owls.



Kumar Paudel Conservationist and Researcher Director, Greenhood Nepal

Kumar Paudel, a 34-year-old native of Sindhupalchok, Nepal, has gained community recognition for his ability to articulate the outcomes of his advanced research in an accessible manner. Holding an MPhil degree from the University of Cambridge in the UK, Paudel currently serves as the director of Greenhood Nepal.

In 2010, he delved into research focusing on individuals convicted of wildlife hunting and illegal trade within Nepalese jails, exploring the multifaceted aspects of "Hunting and trade." This research extended to compiled information on owls as well. Paudel initiated Gandharva, a traditional music initiative in Nepal, with the goal of curbing illegal wildlife trade and spreading awareness about conservation to thousands of people.

While keeping wildlife parts at home is common among both elite and traditional individuals in Nepal, Paudel registered a case in the Supreme Court and successfully won. This legal victory facilitated government actions, allowing for the confiscation of wildlife parts as per the Supreme Court verdict.

Dedicated to pangolin conservation, he spearheaded the "Pangolin Roundtable" and served as co-coordinator for two years in the National Youth Network for Rhino conservation. Paudel's expertise in biodiversity conservation and wildlife crime has led to collaborations with Interpol, the University of Oxford, and the University of Leicester. Throughout his journey, he has traveled to over 50 districts and more than 35 countries.

In the realm of academia, Paudel has authored over 10 scientific articles and four books, covering topics such as community-based conservation, climate change, and forestry. Seven of his articles on forests and wildlife have been published in national newspapers. His contributions have earned him seven national and international grants and honors. Additionally, he has actively contributed to the environmental management course at Pokhara University and the International Union for Conservation of Nature. Thirteen of his students have been engaged in research. He has played a key role in developing 20 types of conservation posters, conducting more than 10 awareness camps, and producing five documentaries related to conservation.

ORGANIZATIONAL FECILITATION 2024



Thirteen years ago, an organization was established in Kailali district, dedicated to the holistic development of women and the environment. It has been actively engaged in various areas such as agriculture, wildlife conservation, cultural preservation, and capacity building. Over this time, the organization has collaborated with 230 young individuals, 2100 students, and 14 eco clubs, working together on diverse wildlife initiatives.

In the Ghodaghodi wetland area, the organization consistently participates in bird monitoring and bird watching. It has played a pivotal role in curbing wildlife hunting and trade. Apart from its efforts in wildlife study, research, and conservation, the organization has undertaken activities such as publishing books and posters, working closely with schools and local communities.

Notably, the organization has taken a leadership role in transforming Ghodaghodi wetland into a Bird Sanctuary. It achieved a milestone by successfully organizing the 10th 'Nepal Owl Festival'.
